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61. Applications for Support, Rescue Support, Qualified, and Retired membership will be made 7 on the form (Membership Application) approved by the Executive Board (Herein after

- 8 referred to as the Board).
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102. Individuals wishing to apply for a change in membership level must submit a completed

11 form (A.1) to the presiding officer prior to the beginning of a Quarterly Business Meeting at

12 which the application will be announced. The presiding officer will present the recently

13 received membership applications at the beginning of each Quarterly Business Meeting to the

14 general membership. Once the application has been presented at the Quarterly Business

15 Meeting, they will be given to the president for board action at any Executive Board meeting

16 convened in accordance with the Bylaws (Article VIII) and held prior to the following

17 Quarterly Business Meeting. If the application is not rejected by the Board it will be

18 presented for consideration at the following Quarterly Business Meeting. Prior to the

19 Quarterly Business Meeting, at the request of the candidate, an application may be

20 withdrawn but not postponed. Applications that are incomplete (no training card, no copy of

a first aid card or certificate or lack of signature(s)) will be considered void immediately after
 the last Executive Board Meeting prior to the Ouarterly Business Meeting at which the

- the last Executive Board Meeting prior to the Quarterly Business Meeting at which the application was to be considered.

37 Quarterly Business Meeting. The Board will not consider an application unless the above
